
THE CASE AGAINST ANOTHER GAS POWER PLANT IN WOODBRIDGE, NJ

Competitive Power Ventures has proposed a 630-megawatt gas-fired power plant amid a densely populated, overburdened environmental justice community



Environmental Injustice: Making a Bad Situation Worse

- The towns that would be most affected by this air pollution are already
 "overburdened" communities, according to NJ's environmental justice law
- Middlesex County already has an ozone pollution rating of





The new power plant would annually emit an additional:

- 2,374,632.8 tons of greenhouse gases
- 148.7 tons of **nitrogen oxides**
- 125.5 tons of **ammonia**
- 123.6 tons of **particulate matter**
- 110.3 tons of carbon monoxide
- 77.6 tons of total **suspended particles**
- 49.9 tons of **volatile organic compounds**
- 39.9 tons of **sulfur dioxide**
- 25.1 tons of **sulfuric acid**
- "less than 25 tons" of **hazardous air pollutants**
- "less than 10 tons" of **formaldehyde**


